Dear Parents

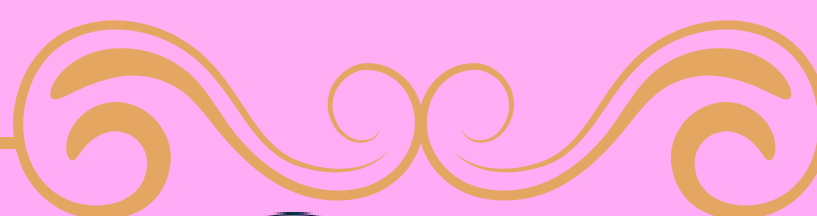

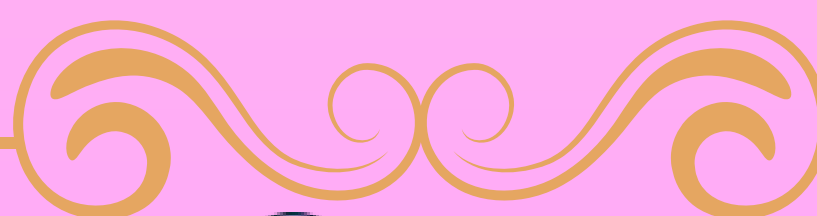
Dear Parents

Dear Parents,

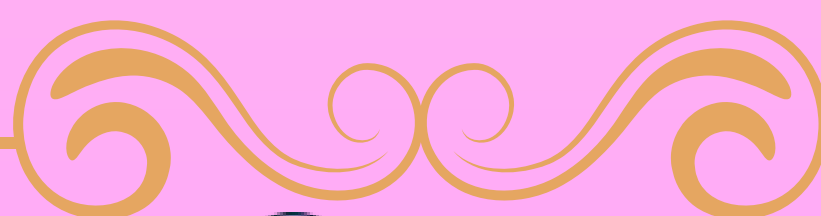

Dear Readers,

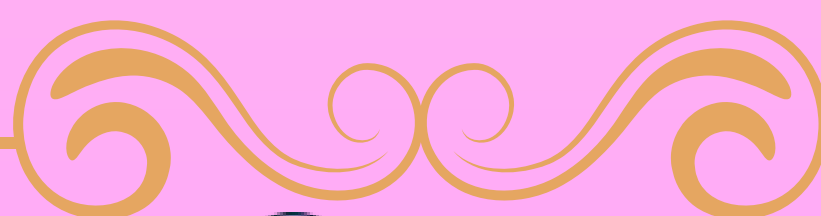
Welcome to the January–June edition of Prism, a reflection of the memorable moments, achievements, and joyful experiences that have enriched our school community during the first half of the year.

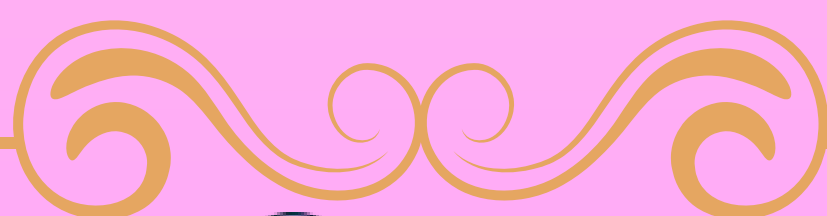

Matchstick P A T T E R N S

An activity using matchsticks was conducted for class LKG students where matchsticks were to be placed on a worksheet by the students. The activity improved fine motor coordination and introduced the idea of collaborative learning. Students worked on their hand-eye coordination and accuracy by applying matchsticks to predetermined outlines on a worksheet.

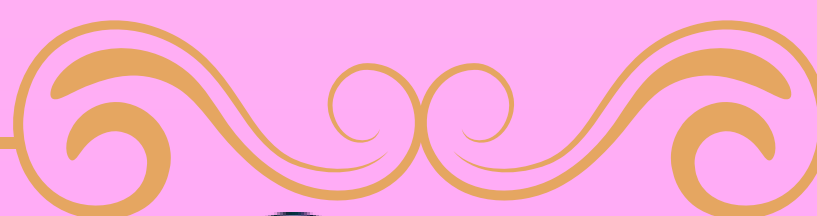
Scribbling DAY

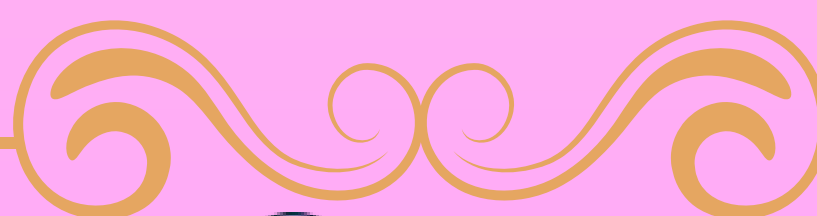
Block P R I N T I N G

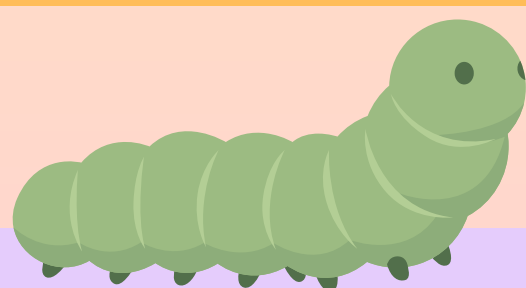


Slogan WRITING

English CALLIGRAPHY

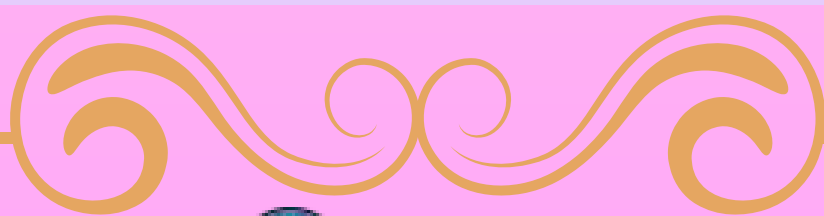

Slogan WRITING

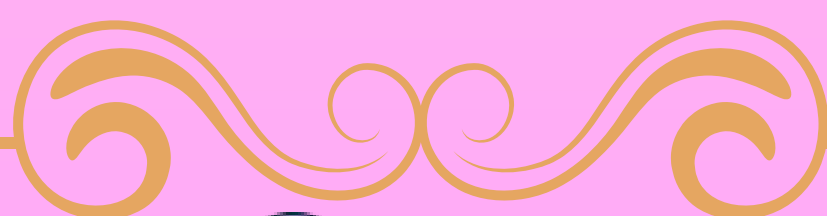

English S P E E C H

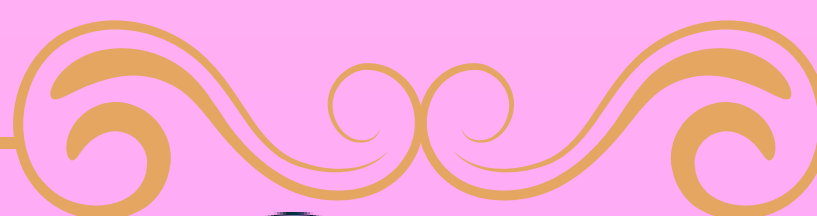

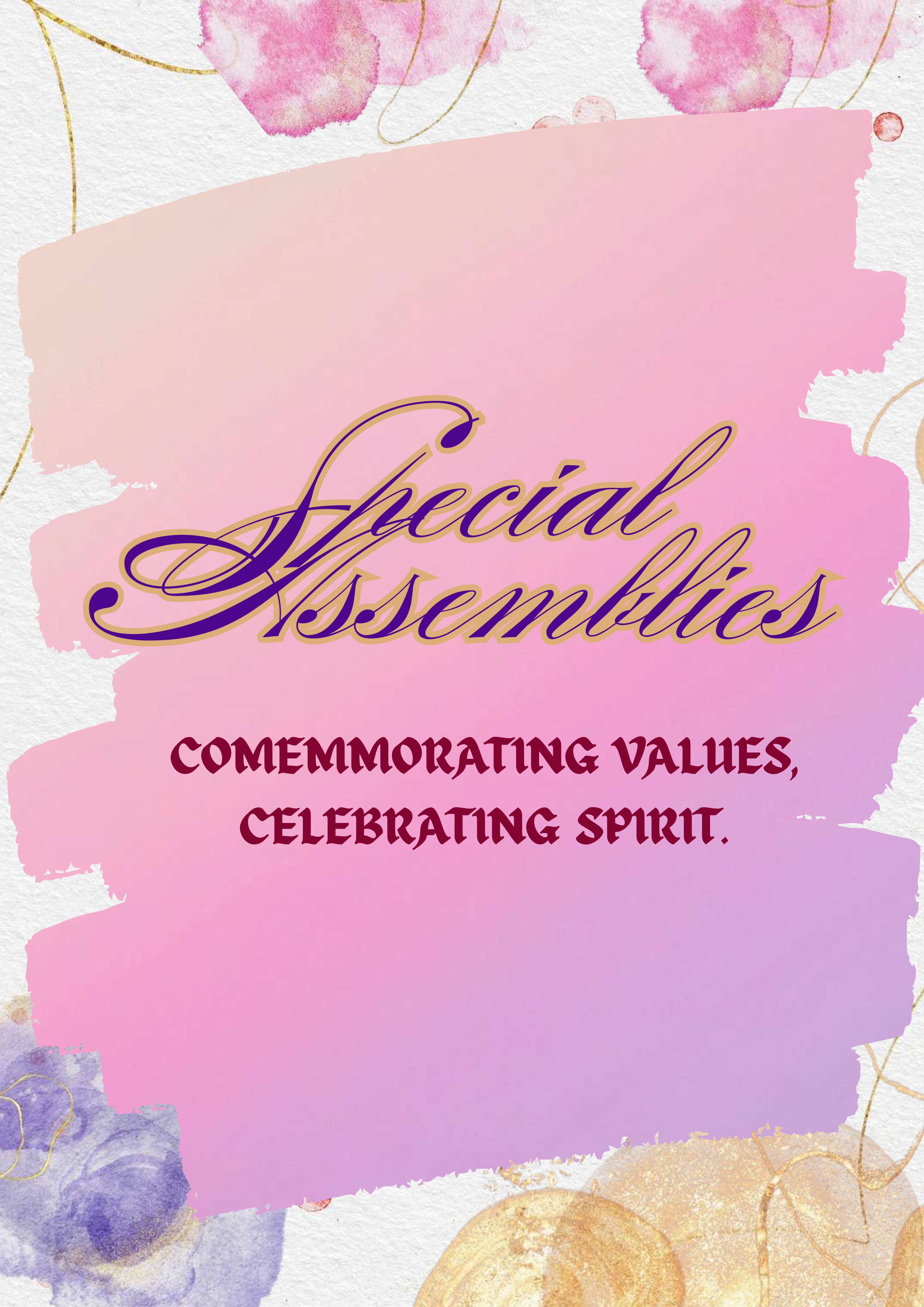


Punjab Mega COLOURING CONTEST

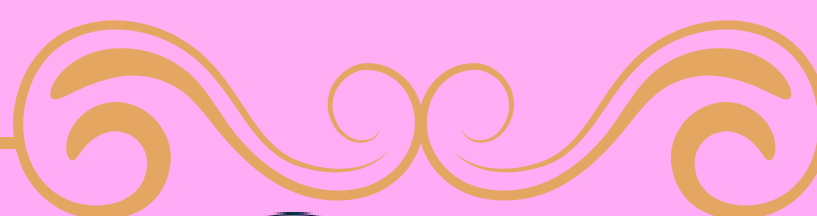


Gratitude WEEK

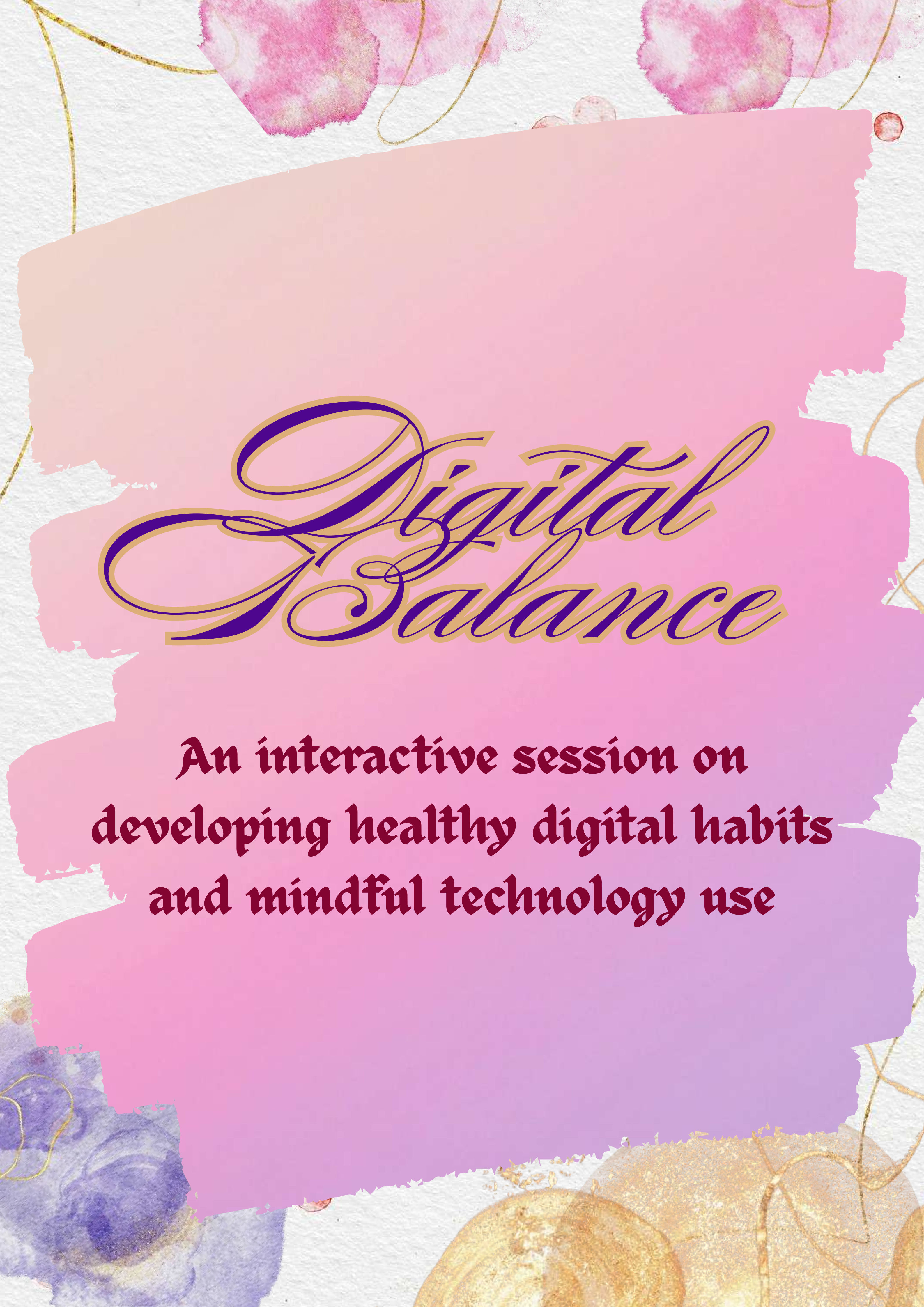

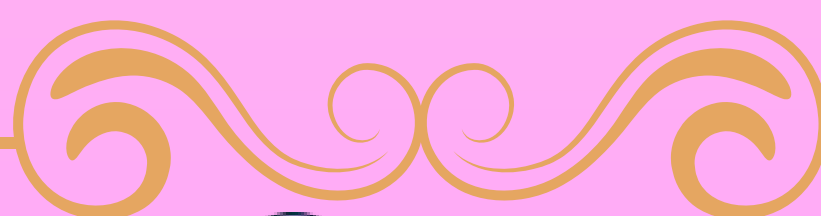

Meditation

Self Reflection



A deeply reflective and insightful teachers' enrichment session titled “The Minds We Shape: Identity, Goals and the Adolescent Brain” was conducted to help educators understand the emotional and psychological realities experienced by adolescents in today's rapidly changing world. The session was led by Mrs Monisha Lorraine Antony and Ms Honhaar Sidhu. The speakers highlighted how small interactions between teachers and students often shape lifelong beliefs children hold about themselves. Teachers were encouraged to look beyond behaviour and understand the emotional needs hidden underneath student reactions.

Dengue Awareness

An awareness session on dengue prevention was conducted for the teachers and the supporting staff. The resource persons, Mr Sukhpal Singh, Senior Health Inspector; Mr Varinder Singh, Health Supervisor, and Mr Sunil Kumar, Health Supervisor, shared valuable information about the causes, symptoms, and preventive measures related to dengue fever. They emphasised the importance of maintaining cleanliness, preventing water stagnation, and adopting timely precautionary measures to curb the spread of mosquito-borne diseases. The session was highly informative and interactive.



C.B.S.E Capacity Building Workshops **LIFE SKILLS, VALUE EDUCATION & LESSON PLANNING**

The capacity building session for teachers was led by the distinguished educator and academic consultant, Dr Nishi Sehrawat Phogat. The session marked the beginning of a meaningful professional development journey aimed at strengthening both pedagogical practices and personal growth. She emphasised that education extends far beyond textbooks and must focus on nurturing responsible, empathetic, and self-aware individuals. Teachers were encouraged to integrate life skills into their everyday classroom practices, making learning more meaningful and holistic.



MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS & GENDER SENSITIVITY

The CBSE capacity building programme focused on mental health awareness in schools and gender sensitivity. Dr Nishi Sehrawat Phogat emphasised the growing need for emotional awareness within school environments and highlighted the role of teachers as not just educators, but also as mentors and support systems for students. Teachers were sensitised to recognise emotional needs, create safe classroom spaces, and encourage open communication. The discussion on gender sensitivity further broadened perspectives, stressing the importance of respect, equality, and inclusivity in everyday interactions.



HAPPY CLASSROOMS

A CBSE Capacity Building Workshop on “Happy Classrooms” empowered teachers from Nursery to Class V with innovative strategies to create joyful, inclusive, and engaging learning environments. Led by resource persons Mr. Sant Kumar Sharma and Ms. Gunwant Kaur Dhillon, the interactive session inspired educators to foster students’ emotional well-being, active participation, and holistic development.



ACTIVE LEARNING

The CBSE Capacity Building Programme on “Active Learning” was organised for teachers of Classes VI to XII. The workshop aimed to strengthen learner-centered teaching practices and promote meaningful classroom engagement. The session was conducted by Dr Dhawan Kumar, CBSE Resource Person and Principal of BBS Indo Canadian School, Bathinda. Through interactive activities and practical examples, he highlighted innovative teaching strategies that encourage critical thinking, collaboration, and active student participation. The programme was graced by Mr Sant Kumar Sharma, Principal of N.R.M. Holy Heart Convent School, Boha, Mansa. 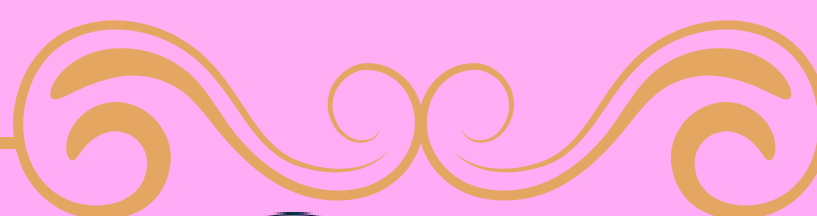

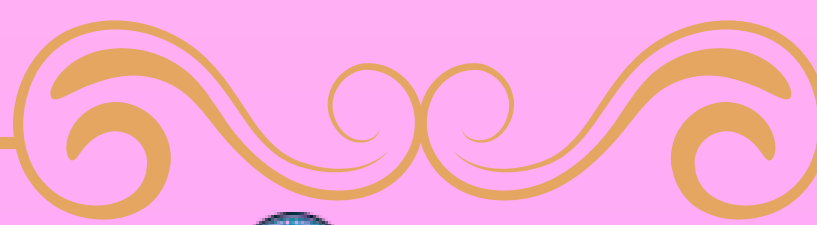

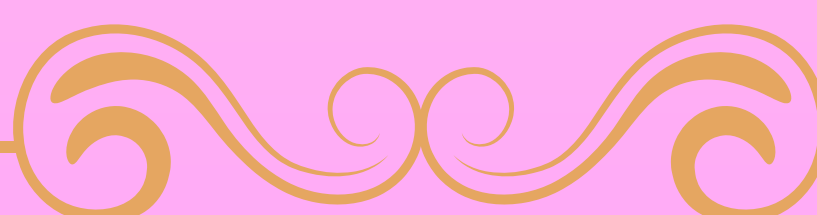
